

ChancesR: Re-Entry, Reunification, and Recovery

Fact Sheet - March 2012

The Beaver County ChancesR: Re-Entry, Reunification, and Recovery Program focuses on Beaver County residents with a substance use disorder (SUD) or a co-occurring substance use and mental health disorder (COD), and who have been sentenced for their crimes to the Beaver County Jail. ChancesR addresses the issues that hinder an offender's successful return to the community upon release from jail and places an emphasis on the difficulties those released face in obtaining and keeping employment. This fact sheet showcases the involvement with Beaver County Rehabilitation Center (BCRC) with the individuals enrolled in the ChancesR Program.

The Program: BCRC

Between June 2011 and February 2012, forty-nine (20.1%) of the individuals enrolled in ChancesR were referred to BCRC while in jail. Types of services provided by BCRC are vocational/educational and employment.

BCRC has been actively working with 37 (75.5%) of those initially referred. These consumers have been active participants, with an average length of stay of a little less than two months (54 days), ranging from less than one day to 158 days, or over five months.

BCRC Mission Statement

"It is the mission of the Beaver County Rehabilitation Center, Inc. to provide the opportunity for vocational growth and independence while respecting the dignity and uniqueness of each individual."

The Services

The figure on the bottom right shows that the majority of clients received both Supported Employment services and Vocational Assessments during their time with BCRC while over half (55.6%) received Psych Rehab services.

Additionally,

- Individuals on average received more Psych Rehab services (4.2) than Supported Employment services (3.7);
- Over three-fourths (77.8%) of individuals received more than one type of service. Only eight participants received just one service.
