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Advantages of Choosing a Voluntary Commitment (“a 201”)

It's all about you!

You can discreetly request a psychiatric evaluation at any of these locations:

- An Outpatient Provider
- A local Emergency Room
- WPIC-Beaver County Crisis

and work with the staff to determine the level of treatment that you need.

Maintain your Privacy!

Your Protected Health Information (PHI) is confidential and protected under HIPAA and Pennsylvania regulations.

Under a 201 commitment, no information is submitted to the Pennsylvania State Police regarding your psychiatric admission or treatment.

It's Drama-Free!

- No police.
- No restraints.
- No required hearings during the admission process.

When you need to be hospitalized...

If a hospital admission is necessary, **YOU** can select where you go for treatment. Two local options (depending on availability) include:

Under a 201 commitment, **YOU** have more rights and more control of the length of your hospital stay. For example, with a written notice, **YOU** can request your discharge date. On the other hand, **YOU** can extend your in-patient stay for as long as you and/or the medical staff believe that there is a continued need for treatment.

The least restrictive care is always preferred, but when further aid is needed, **WPIC-Beaver County Crisis** can also facilitate referrals to community resources and other supports such as transportation to the hospital.

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
