## Community Partners

In addition to the programs directly administered by TCBC, we also partner with a number of organizations who provide services directly out of our Beaver Falls location. See below for a list of our partner organizations and learn how they can help!

### Holy Family Institute

Duquesne Light CAP (Customer Assisted Program) provides a reduced monthly payment on customers' electric bill. The program offers forgiveness for partial arrears and adjusts monthly payments based on the customer's ability to pay. The Dollar Energy program works to help customers obtain grants for electric, gas, and water utilities.

### The Franklin Center

The Franklin Center of Beaver County facilitates access to life-changing opportunities for the low-income, the underserved, and those in need. The program links consumers with human service programs, medical care, workforce development, clothing and housing essentials, educational programs, energy assistance, and housing opportunities.

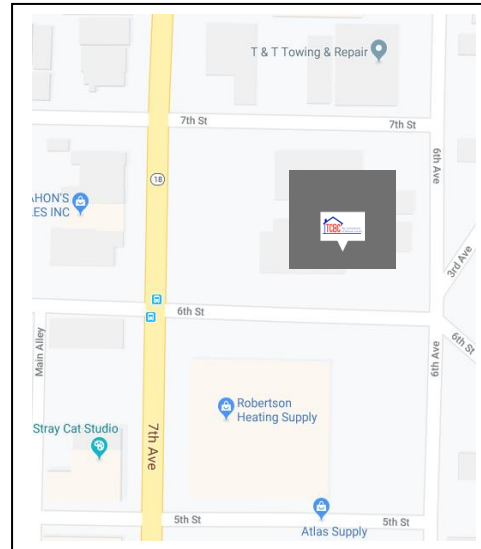
### Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank

The Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank works with the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), once known as food stamps, to help individuals and families make ends meet. Depending on income guidelines, SNAP recipients are allotted a specific dollar amount loaded onto a debit card, which gives you the freedom to choose what you eat.

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# WHO WE ARE

The Cornerstone of Beaver County (TCBC), is a nonprofit organization, located at 600 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Beaver Falls, PA 15010, that provides a variety of programs serving individuals and families who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

In addition to the programs directly administered by TCBC, there are a number of partner organizations providing services from the Cornerstone's Beaver Falls location. These organizations include: The Greater Pittsburgh Community Foodbank, Holy Family Institute's Duquesne Light CAP program, and The Franklin Center of Beaver County.

## To help us assist you, please bring the following documents upon your visit:

- Photo ID for all adults living in the household
- Social Security Cards for all adults AND children living in the household
- Birth certificates for everyone living in the household
- Proof of income, including pay stubs dated within 30 days of intake, SSI or SSDI statements for any household members, child support statement, proof of Department of Public Welfare benefits, including TANF or Food Stamps
- Housing or utility information, including eviction notice, letter from landlord with eviction date, letter from agency on letterhead that you are living in shelter or transitional housing, utility company shut-off notice, and a copy of your lease



# OUR PROGRAMS



## Emergency Solutions Grant

Provides assistance to households who are homeless or at risk of being homeless. Assistance provided includes case management, financial assistance, budgeting, and referrals to community resources. We also provide street outreach services.

## Coordinated Entry

Coordinated entry is a centralized intake process for homeless households seeking housing assistance. The process includes a standardized assessment to identify housing barriers and to determine the best level of housing assistance. Linkage to other needed service is available.



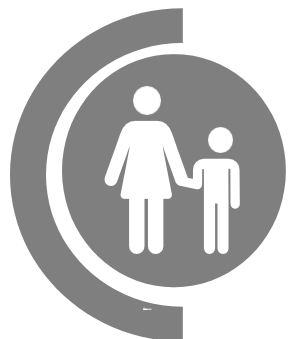
## Fair Housing

The mission of the Beaver County Fair Housing Office is to create equal housing opportunities for all persons living in Beaver County by educating and enforcing the Fair Housing laws that prohibit discrimination in housing on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, disability, and familial status. The Beaver County Fair Housing Office is guided by the federal law that establishes national policies to ensure that all Americans have equal access to the housing of their choice.



## Supportive Services for Veteran Families

The Supportive Services for Veteran Families program provides temporary assistance to veterans who are experiencing a housing crisis. You must be a former Active Duty Veteran. SSVF can help with rental assistance, employment services, case management consisting of housing search and placement, security deposit, life skills, linkages to mainstream resources, referrals, financial literacy and budgeting assistance.



## Motel Assistance

The Cornerstone of Beaver County helps pay for a short term hotel stay during a housing crisis.

## Supportive Services for CYF Families

The Supportive Services for CYF Families program helps children and youth families locate and sustain permanent housing.

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
