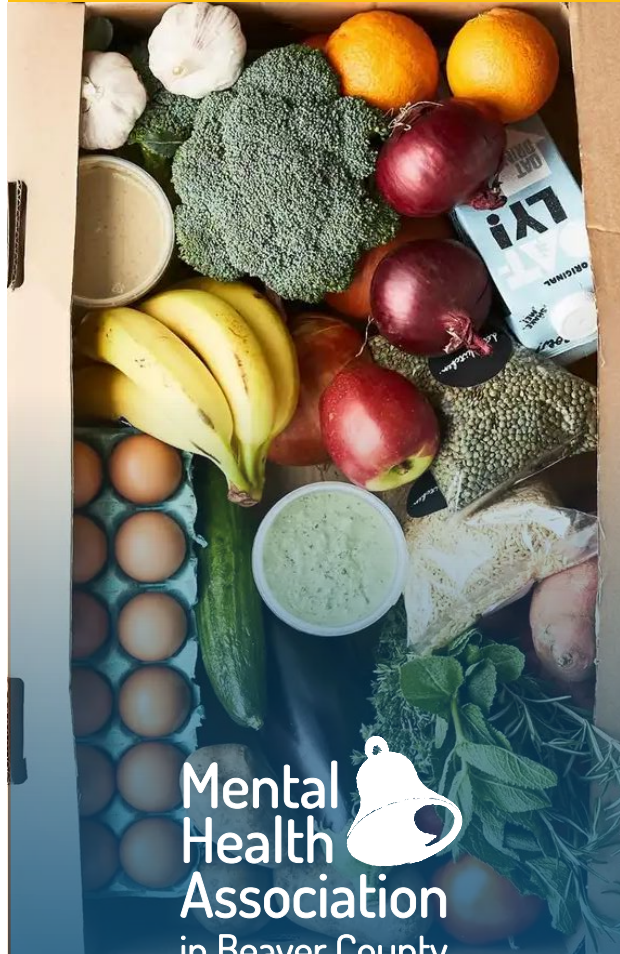

THE MHA MEAL KIT PROGRAM

Food insecurity occurs with individuals with disabilities and their families for various reasons. Regardless of the cause, the problem oftentimes requires immediate attention. Our solution is to provide boxes of food that contain all of the ingredients that individuals/families will need to prepare complete meals.

How the MHA Meal Kit Program works:

- Meal Kit Program requests are made through behavioral health providers. If you do not have a case manager or treatment team, call us directly.
- The MHA Meal Kit Program Coordinator will verify your name, address, phone number, as well as the date and time food delivery will be made. Food boxes can also be left on the porch if requested.
- Meal kits can be delivered monthly or as a one-time request.
- All requests will be considered.

The Meal Kit Program is NOT:

- 24-hour a day on-demand food service.
- A hot meal service. All meals provided will need to be prepared/cooked by the individual/family.
- Meant to replace other viable options such as: local food pantries, Food Stamps/EBT or local soup kitchens.
